The 2022-2023 Board of Missions was comprised of Joe and Karin Aucone and Dick and Anne Steadman.

In October, we were able to host a Welcome to America party at the Steadman's, where we meet and develop relationships with new International students from Salem State University.

Joe Mellon, our long time missionary serving in France, came in November. During this time, he preached and shared about his ministry at a potluck lunch. He also met with various members of the church.

In December, Anne Steadman coordinated Project Angel Tree with Prison Fellowship. This is where we get names of local children who have a parent incarcerated, we get gift requests, buy the gift then deliver them in the name of the parent and Jesus. We served 18 children in the North Shore area.

I am a member of UBridge support team made up of members of other North Shore churches to meet with and pray for Mollie Clark as she serves with Intervarsity on the Salem State University and Endicott College campuses. Our church contributed funds to help students go on the Serve Up trip to Iceland in March.

In February, Young Life led a missions trip to El Salvador with members from Grace, and we were able to contribute material for them to bring there.

REPORT OF THE YOUTH MINISTRY

To the members and friends of Grace Community Church of Marblehead, report of the Youth Ministry.

In September of 2022, I was blessed with the leadership role of GCC's Youth Group. My desire was to continue what past leadership had started and continue to listen to the Holy Spirit as He leads this group. As a church, we are seeking to authentically live out the grace of Jesus and that also applies to the Youth Group. Everything we have done as a group has sought to give the youth of GCC a place where they can have fellowship with other Christians their own age and learn about Jesus.

In the past, GCC's mission statement has been, "To meet middle and high-school aged students where they are in their faith journeys and foster their growth into grace-filled, mission-minded, and Biblically-literate disciples of Jesus Christ." My desire has always been to continue within this mission statement.

As a Youth Group, we can't survive without volunteers. When I had taken over from the previous leadership, I was blessed with a good group of people who are committed to being a part of these kid's lives. Our leaders are Andrew Major, Kristen Mortensen, Jeremy Kovac, and Bethany Misarski. They have given their time and attention into these kid's lives. As leaders, we try to meet once a month and go over a book together talking about discipleship. My heart is that we continue to focus on disciplining each other as we disciple the youth of GCC.

When I took over in September, we were meeting on Sundays after church. We would have a lesson, a meal and a game. The first thing we did as leaders was tell our testimonies. The purpose of this was to share how we came to know Jesus ourselves and how our stories are a part of the greater story of God's redemption. From there, we moved onto a lesson on the Lord's Prayer. After a few months of meeting on Sunday, I officially moved the time of Youth Group to Wednesday night. The reason for doing this was to provide a time during the week where kids can have a time of fellowship outside of Sunday. This also opened up an opportunity for more youth to come.

Since January, we started going over a new lesson called Gospel Basics. The purpose of this lesson was to clarify what the central message of Christianity is and how the understanding and applying of that message to everyday life is the heart of discipleship to Jesus. My heart in doing this was so each kid knows that the Christian life is fueled by an ever-growing understanding and sensing of the Gospel message; that as Christians we are saved as individuals but placed into a community and called to be the Church in the every day. From a strong understanding of the Gospel, every Christian is called to fulfill the mission of making disciples of Jesus as their primary purpose in life. This is all about Jesus and what he has done for those who believe; bringing out the heart of the Christian message, which is the Gospel. We have continued to go through this lesson and will finish around mid-May.

As a Youth Group, we have had youth outings, such as mini-golf, movie night, and Mario Kart night. The goal of these nights always has been to have fun but also to build relationships with kids. This summer, we will be doing a lot more events over more formal meeting times. My goal for the next few months is to separate Middle and High School groups to two different meetings. The goal is to grow and expand the group and part of that is giving kids a more ageappropriate lesson and game for either Middle School or High School youth groups.

As a Church, I think it's very important that we prioritize at all times the ministry of our kids. Youth Group provides kids with mentors and people who can model what it means to authentically live out the grace of Jesus (Psalm. 71:17-18, Titus 2:1-8). Kids need a good community to encourage each other in the faith (Hebrews 10:24-25). Kids need a purpose, a mission, and meeting together weekly to figure out what it means to be a disciple of Jesus making disciples. Today, kids are influenced by a lot of outside sources, and good Gospel centered theology is important. Youth Group is a place where kids can wrestle through the theology they have been taught or learn it for the first time; resulting in kids knowing their own faith on a greater level (Ephesians 4:14-15). Our goal as a youth group is to continue to provide a space for kids to know Jesus and make it known to others; disciples making disciples. This is really only something Jesus can do and as group we humbly submit to Jesus; asking Him to bless this ministry and that His will would be done.

REPORT OF THE FACILITIES TEAM

To the members and friends of Grace Community Church of Marblehead, the report of the Facilities Team.

The major project this year was the renovation of our church steeple. Michael Kehn and his crew replaced defective framing and the four louvers surrounding the bell. The exterior or the tower was primed and painted. A full report of the work done follows this report.

Repair work that was completed this year included:

- Painting of the Fellowship Hall, stairway, and exterior doors.
- Repair of pews in Sanctuary
- Repair of the kitchen and church office exterior doors.
- The front stairs and deck of the parsonage were replaced.

A huge "Thank You" goes out to Bob and Paula Martorelli and Mita Snow for their help in completing these projects.

Pending work for this coming year includes repair of the piping to the Baptistry and replacement of defective siding on the church building. We have budgeted \$10,000 for this upcoming work.

We would like to recognize and say "Thank You" to Heidi Bevins and Jared Ayer for faithfully beautifying the front of our church building with beautiful garlands and fresh plantings.

GCC STEEPLE REPORT

The Challenge:

- For several years, we have had pieces of trim falling from the steeple.
- It was very hard to do a full inspection of the Condition.
- We had some funds from the previous Capital Campaign to address this critical need, but didn't have an actionable plan.

Solutions we explored:

Mike Kehn has worked on the steeple before, and in the past year brought us three detailed options:

- Rent a huge crane; fix the steeple
- Build a huge platform; fix the steeple
- Remove a section of the bell tower.

In the end, we decided, with Mike's advice, on Solution 2. Mike built the entire platform in his yard on Green Street, in a modular fashion so it could be disassembled, transported, lifted into place, reassembled, and then removed safely.

Initial, simple scope defined

- Re-make the missing pieces that had fallen
- Refasten any loose boards
- Scrape and patch
- Repaint

Actual scope of work accomplished, under Mike Kehn's leadership:

- Designed and built a platform
- Lifted platform into place and secured it
- Evaluated all components in detail
- Communicated options to elder team
- Rebuilt much of the bell tower exterior
- Scraped and painted everything
- Safely removed the platform

In Mike's words...

We replaced the entire wood cladding from the top of the louvers to the bottom. We used a treated wood product called LifeSpan. It is a solid knot-free pine that is treated so it cannot rot, and then it comes primed with two coats of an oil-based primer on all sides. We reprimed with oil on all cuts we made. The moldings we had reproduced were made of Spanish Cedar. The fasteners we used were stainless steel. Trim head and standard gauge screws. The upper section above the louvers were completely stripped of many layers of lead paint and refastened

with stainless steel nails and screws. The LifeSpan wood cost between \$7.50 to \$10.00 per board foot. We also installed new 3/4" UDL exterior fir plywood sheathing under the cladding. This gave additional strength to the bell tower plus a solid base to apply the LifeSpan cladding. The original scope of work did not include replacing the entire wood cladding and sheathing. Nor did it include replacing the louvers. The use of the platform made this work possible, safe and easy to do. The decision to make and install the platform was decided by the Grace Church group of guys that made up this special oversight committee. It proved to be a very good decision."

We would like to reiterate our thanks to:

- To God, for providing resources, and for safety along the way
- To Mike Kehn, for fantastic leadership, great communication, quality work
- To the church family who gave and supported this effort

The total cost of the project was \$71,873.32. All outstanding costs are confirmed as paid.
